1.	67404	POSITIVE	<p>The Mid-term Evaluation Committee for doctoral candidates assessed the timeliness and alignment of the research work with the schedule defined in the Individual Research Plan (IRP). They also evaluated the academic maturity of the doctoral candidate based on their participation in discussion and their ability to present research problems and results obtained during the research process. According to the Committee, the main activities outlined in the IRB have been partially completed. While there were some delays in the execution of specific research tasks compared to the planned schedule, the doctoral candidate provided clear and factual explanations for the reasons behind these delays and presented a remedial plan. Both Reviewers expressed opinions and suggestions related to the progress of IRP. The issue raised by both Reviewers was the size of recruited patients. The doctoral candidate demonstrates good scientific activity, actively participates in conferences, and improves their qualifications through international training. Both Reviewers stressed the need to intensify work on the publications, pointing out a significant delay in this respect compared to the IRP.</p>
2.	72839	POSITIVE	<p>In the opinion of both reviewers, the implementation of the IRP is on schedule, and the research project's design is very well thought out. The candidate has mastered the research workshop very well and has demonstrated a high level of knowledge of the theoretical underpinnings of the research undertaken. The presentation of the results was very interesting and indicated the research enthusiasm of the Ph.D. student. The candidate provided comprehensive and mature answers to the questions. During the evaluated period, the doctoral candidate has demonstrated high scientific activity and innovation. Considering the candidate's research achievements so far and the timeliness of completing various stages of the research, the Committee has concluded that the study is being conducted correctly, and there are no threats to meeting the planned deadline for completing the doctoral dissertation.</p>
